

LEAN and Kaizen - Learning Journey to Japan



Seminar 'Lean Production and Management - Operational Excellence of Companies in Japan'

Our Benchmark Training Journey is scheduled for the duration of **8 days**. It starts on a Saturday and ends on the Saturday of the following week (departure from Europe on Friday, return and arrival in Europe on Sunday of the following week, see example below).

We offer the possibility of an **Open Japan Seminar** for executives and improvement experts from various companies as well as an **Exclusive Japan Seminar** for a closed group of participants of a single company.

Before the trip to Japan begins, a **one-day preparatory seminar** will be held to provide participants with the necessary background knowledge and prepare them for the seminar week. The seminar language is German or English. In addition, mixed solutions are also possible, e.g. subgroups with their own interpreters in their own language.

About the concept: In addition to a thorough introduction to the philosophy and the management tools of lean production, the seminar provides a unique insight into the practice of selected flagship companies in Japan. The seminar focuses on two areas. Firstly, the **application of lean production** with the associated methodical approaches and activities in different flagship companies. The second focus is the accompanying **leadership style** – the key success factor for any programme of lean reforms or continuous improvement activities.

The seminar will allow participants to experience lean leadership first-hand; it will provide ideas and inspiration – with an invigorating and lasting impact beyond the duration of the trip. The Learning Journey is not limited to company visits: The seminar concept ensures a qualified evaluation of what has been observed via intensive individual and group work. This is designed to transfer the experience of the individual participant to their own personal sphere and area of responsibility – with the aim of conveying ideas for their workplace (lean / leadership) and providing a powerful impetus for the improvement process in their own company. The fundamental concept is: Ultimately, the only thing that counts is what is then implemented in your own company.



Our online survey of participants from 2012 – 2015 has confirmed the effectiveness of the concept and that subsequent improvements are made: over 80% of respondents reported that

- specific improvement measures had been implemented, and
- there had been a change in their own leadership style.

So not only did the participants personally benefit, there were also specific gains for their companies. (The questions and answers from the online survey and their evaluation can be found on the website below.)

The participation fee for the preparatory training and seminar week in Japan is between **7400 EUR** (net). The price for participants includes preparatory training, company tours, and domestic travel expenses (hotels, conference rooms, bus rentals); however, it does not include travel costs to and from Japan and evening meals. In principle, a Japan Seminar can be held if the minimum number of participants required for the seminar to be held has been reached. The minimum number of participants is 16. The aim is a group of 20 participants.

The seminar is not suitable for persons with **limited mobility** because of the factory tours in the Japanese companies.



- · Organisation and execution of the 'Learning Journey'
- Advance information for participants' travel preparations
